About us. Meet some of our Executive Board Members,

President: Alberto Espinas



Alberto Espinas, MSN, RN currently leads the revitalized PNA California Capital City chapter (formerly Greater Sacramento Area chapter). He has been a member of the PNAA since 1997. He is the founding President of the PNA Ocean County Subchapter in New Jersey on that same year of 1997. He was then elected and served as a Board Member of the PNA NJ chapter from 2000-2002. After finishing his term with PNANJ in 2002, his family moved to Texas and eventually formed the PNA South Texas, Rio Grande Valley chapter in 2004, and served as the founding President. In his search for another job in line with nursing, he found himself moving again to California.

In 2010, he once again sowed the seeds of the PNAA and thus facilitated the formation of the PNA Greater Sacramento chapter and served as the Adviser of the organization. Just when he thought he was done with chapter formation, he found himself again recruiting nurses in the Napa-Solano County area and started the PNA Napa-Solano chapter in 2018 where he is still serving as an adviser to the group. This time, Mr. Espinas' latest PNA involvement is not by forming a new one but re-invigorating a nearly dormant chapter, the PNA Greater Sacramento. He will be guiding this group of young and motivated leaders and members for the next two years armed with strong determination that he will be able to instill to them that sense of commitment.

Mr. Espinas is currently employed as a Quality Nurse consultant by Kaiser Foundation Hospital and Health Plan at the Regional Clinical Quality Programs and Data Analytics department. Their department monitors the twenty-one Kaiser Permanente hospitals in the Northern California region, where they specifically monitor patients who are identified as high risk and then communicates the critical information to the Rapid Response nurses at the facilities for appropriate intervention. The program that they use is called AAM which stands for Advance Alert Monitor. It is a program that uses predictive analytics to address serious complications before it happens. This program has been recognized recently by the International Hospital Federation.

Jane Pena



As a Nurse Manager, I am responsible for daily unit operations of a 28-bed unit, oversees staffing, and ensures staff competencies. Responsible for ensuring quality care is delivered to each patient.

Since 2016, I serve as the project manager for the inpatient acuity system, GRASP – Responsible in ensuring that patient care acuity system is reflective of the nursing care hours and safely aligned to staffing needs of the units.

In addition to working at UC Davis, I hold a supplemental RN position at Methodist Hospital ACU/Pre-op area as a pre-op/post-op nurse.

I have been with UC Davis since Oct 2001 and have worked in different capacity as a staff nurse starting in the float pool until finding a home in the transplant unit as a staff nurse, clinical resource nurse, assistant nurse manager and eventually taking on the manager position in 2014.

PNAC3 and UC Davis Health Celebrate the 1st PCS Diversity, Equity & Inclusion (DEI) Grand Rounds at Sacramento Campus

"The Philippine Nurses Association California Capital City (PNAC3) chapter and the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) committee came together to celebrate the history, work experience, and culture of the Filipino nurses who have chosen to work at UC Davis Health. Filipino nurses make up a sizable proportion of the UC Davis Health workforce. This event also commemorated the Philippine Independence Day Celebration happening on June 12 (from the Spanish colonization in 1898).

The DEI committee held its first Grand Rounds on June 7, 2022, in collaboration with the PNAC3 chapter. At the Grand Rounds, the panelists talked about their previous experiences, current issues that Filipino nurses may be facing, and how to become future leaders within UC Davis Health. Aida Azurin, a retired RN who worked at UC Davis for 35 years and was the Assistant Nurse Manager on East 6, was one of the panelists. The other panelists were Jane Pena, Inpatient Unit Director and Nurse Manager of Tower 8, and Nico Buan-Lagazo, Outpatient Transplant Center Nurse Manager. The question-and-answer portion of the DEI Grand Rounds was moderated by Kywaita Keys, Chair of PCS DEI Council. Participants at the event earned Continuing Education credits via the Center for Professional Practice of Nursing.

In closing, Elizabeth Navarra, Mark Buan-Lagazo, Salvador Mislant, and Jojo Melendres performed the national bamboo dance "Tinikling." Tinikling is the skillful tottering of dancers over parallel bamboo poles that open and close rhythmically with the traditional music. It is based on the folklore of birds trying their might pecking on the harvest grains while farmers are at work in the rice fields. 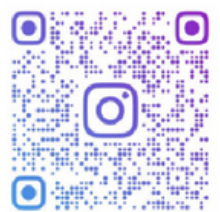

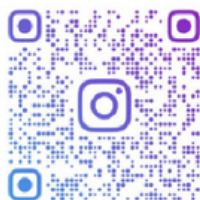

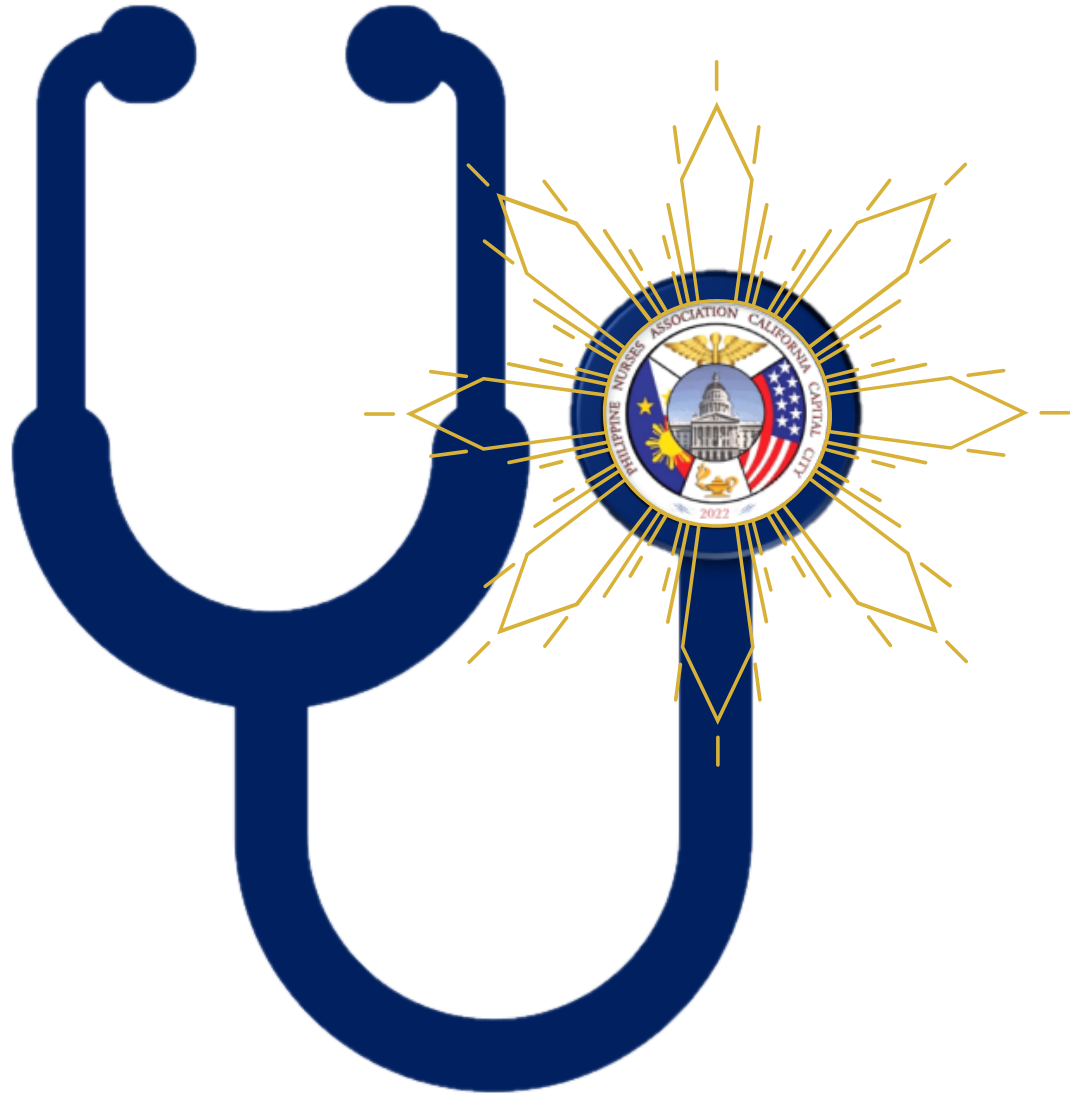
