4th Annual Breaking Down Barriers to Nursing

In alignment with the Future of Nursing 2020-2030 recommendations, Capitol City Black Nurses Association proudly hosted the 4th Annual Breaking Down Barriers to Nursing Conference in collaboration with Sacramento chapters of the National Association of Hispanic Nurses, Hmong Nurses Association, and PNAA California Capital City (PNAC3). Breaking Down Barriers was a labor of love, demonstrating firsthand how community collaboration has the potential to impact future change and address diversity in nursing.

Held at Sacramento State College of Health & Human Services, this event, which focused on increasing representation in healthcare by empowering underrepresented communities to pursue careers in nursing, had 140+ high school attendees and second-degree folks participate.

How do we break down the barriers to getting into nursing? How do we get into the profession? Nurses representing various specialties and backgrounds volunteered to answer these questions through multiple presentations, panel discussions, and simulation lab tours. Regional nursing schools and professional nursing organizations participated and provided information about their organizations. Together, we addressed gaps and removed barriers to nursing by allowing everyone to network in a safe space.

PNAC3 was well represented throughout the event.

Sal Mislang was our PNAC3 event representative and provided members with event updates. On the day of the event, he volunteered as a "runner" to ensure that presenters and rooms were well-equipped to make scheduled sessions successful.

Dr. Sandy Phan moderated a panel discussion of local nurses and nurse leaders on the topic of "Honoring Culture and Identity." The panel discussed how they honored their culture and intersecting identities while navigating healthcare and educational institutions.

Daniel Aquino and PNAC3 President Jojo Melendres were panelists in the "Nursing Specialties" discussion. We offered a glimpse into our personal journeys in nursing and provided insight into the various specialties we've held throughout our respective careers.

Upon completion, the ticket will serve as a pass to the set of meals including appetizers, entrees, desserts, and drinks.

Another engaging part of the program was the "We Are All Connected" team-building activity. Attendees passed around a yarn and shared what motivates them to go to work and the passion which they are currently working on.

The last game was a combination of winner-take-all and rock-paper-scissors. After four rounds, Frances Noriega, adviser, won the \$16 prize, which she donated to PNAC3.

In between the activities, Melendres announced the upcoming Hike and Learn in November, the award-winning project that takes participants to different trails in Northern California and simultaneously earns continuing education hours. 




PNAC3 Scholarship


Mount Tamalpais







