Medical Pathway Connect

On April 2, PNAC3 member Daniel Aquino was invited to serve as a tour guide for a group of approximately 50 local high school students participating in the "Medical Pathway Connect" program, designed to inspire interest in healthcare careers. As part of the experience, the students toured several key areas within the hospital, including the inpatient Dialysis Unit, Neuroscience Unit, Accelerated Access Unit, and the ACC Primary Care Clinic.

Throughout the day, students had the opportunity to engage with professionals across a wide range of roles, including Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Dialysis Technicians, Hospital Unit Service Coordinators, Providers, Pharmacists, Human Resources, Volunteer Services, and even a hospital Executive. The goal of the program was to showcase the diversity and impact of healthcare careers and to spark an interest that may one day lead these students to pursue a future in the field, whether at UC Davis Health or beyond.



Ehime Exchange

On March 5, UC Davis Health had the privilege of hosting four nursing students and a faculty member from Ehime University in Matsuyama, Japan, as part of an educational exchange aimed at exploring the differences between healthcare systems in the United States and Japan.

The visit was made possible through the collaborative efforts of multiple hospital units and leaders, coordinated by a dedicated staff member committed to showcasing both the grit and glamour of UC Davis Health. The guests toured several key departments, including Pediatrics, the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), the Emergency Department (ED), and the Operating Rooms (OR). During their visit, they were welcomed by nursing students from various local schools and had the opportunity to meet professionals from Child Life Services, Hospital Unit Service Coordinators (HUSCs), Environmental Services (EVS), Food & Nutrition Services, clinical providers, and many others who play essential roles in delivering high-quality patient care.

Notable highlights from the day included a tour of the newly opened Panda Cares space for pediatric patients and an intense, firsthand look at UC Davis Health's Level 1 trauma center in action, where they observed three resuscitation cases in rapid succession. In the OR, the group witnessed complex procedures including a head and neck dissection, a free flap surgery, and a bypass graft.

After a high-energy morning, the visitors enjoyed lunch before going to the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing at UC Davis, where they participated in a poverty simulation and small-group debriefs with Master's Entry Program in Nursing (MEPN) students.

The experience was deeply meaningful for all involved, offering a rich exchange of knowledge and perspectives. For Daniel Aquino who facilitated this event and led the tour, the day served as a powerful reminder of the scope and impact of nursing and healthcare—reigniting a sense of pride and appreciation for the work done across the organization.

Special thanks were extended to California State University–Sacramento School of Nursing for reaching out to the Center for Professional Practice of Nursing to make this tour possible with Ehime University. Hopefully, this leads to a future exchange with nursing students from the Philippines!

PNAC3 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Members of the PNAC3 are eligible to receive a \$1,000 award to put toward an undergraduate or graduate nursing degree. Applicants must submit a personal essay, evidence of excellent academic performance, and two letters of recommendation from mentors, faculty, or supervisors.

Applications for this award open on June 5th and close on September 5th at 11:59 pm PST. Award recipients will be announced in October.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,000 for two award recipients.

SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES: The Philippine Nurses Association California Capital Chapter (PNAC3) is pleased to award \$1000 to two of its selected members pursuing an undergraduate or a graduate nursing degree. The purpose of this scholarship is to support nursing education advancement for PNAC3 members, thus achieving one of PNAC3's core missions.

Scholars to provide PNAC3 membership on how the scholarship prepared and helped achieve their educational goals, professional and/or academic aspirations, and any commitment to giving back to the community as a quick presentation during the PNAC3 monthly meeting post-graduation.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

PNAC3 Criteria:

- 1. At least one year or more of PNAC3 membership, letter of verification from PNAC3 Membership Committee, or PNAC3 card
- 2. Two letters of recommendation from academic faculty/advisors/supervisor/mentors addressing the following areas:
 - a.academic performance,
 - b.leadership, and
 - c.commitment to diversity.

ACADEMIC Criteria:

- 3. Current enrollment in an accredited undergraduate or graduate nursing program (associate degree, bachelor's, master's, or doctoral levels)
- 4. Most recent unofficial transcript from school or university as evidence of excellent academic performance (GPA > 3.0)
- 5. Personal essay addressing nursing career goal, leadership potential, career trajectory, and dedication to serving PNAC3 (500-word max)




REQUIREMENTS FOR REIMBURSEMENT:

- 6. Disbursement of awards following presentation by the Treasurer.
